From what I remember, on Aug. 2 1964 the Maddox was attacked for the first time, and then on Aug. 4th the Turner Joy and the Maddox were attacked.

I'm not sure of the date the Edwards was involved, but I thought it was about a week later, but it could have easily been on Sept. 18th. Radar reported 4 fast moving small contacts heading toward the Edwards. Shells were fired at that time and supposedly several boats were sunk with the rest turning and heading back behind Haiman Island. I understood, from shipboard skuttlebutt at the time that a torpedo had been sighted from the craft and also that strike aircraft had been called in.

I can not verify the torpedo, or the strike aircraft, but can verify that shots were fired at 4 approaching radar contacts.
