We had lost a beloved husband, father, grandfather, friend, and the kindest most gentle man we knew. The world is a dimmer place without the light in his eyes and his shy, beguiling smile. Lee was born in Salt Lake City, Utah on March 9, 1943. He was a quiet, sweet tempered child who grew to be a handsome man with a heart full of love and compassion for all people and all life on Earth. All who knew him were drawn in to his peaceful presence. Lee's parents Ginny and Roy and his brother Toby moved to San Mateo in 1953. They lived there for over 50 years. Lee's brother Bill and sister Debbie were born in San Mateo. All attended Meadow Heights and Hillsdale High School.
